

At a routine 20 week pregnancy ultrasound, their baby boy was diagnosed with Spina Bifida. Spina Bifida can come with a wide range of health issues and disabilities. Upon learning of the diagnosis, they were referred to CHOP and were candidates for fetal surgery, in hopes to stop further damage to Mathias' spine and brain. Tamara went through 3 long days of testing on both Mathias' and herself, and found she was eligible for this surgery. This surgery was Mathias' best chance at a normal life although is not without risks for mom and baby.
