Pastor's Page

Easter Greetings Summer Hill!

Can you feel it? I sure do. I wasn't exactly sure what it was, but I have been feeling some powerful energy radiating through St. Paul's Summer Hill. At first, I was thinking it must just be from the beautiful spring days we have had, but then I still felt it even when those pesky colder days kept coming. I certainly felt it all during the Lenten season, but it kept getting stronger and stronger each week. I think everyone must have felt it on Easter morning with the wonderful worship experiences we had at the sunrise, breakfast, and regular services.

I cannot help but think that this is the same feeling the disciples must have felt in the weeks after that very first Easter day, when the Risen Lord appeared to them with greetings of "Peace be with you." During the next forty days, Jesus continued to appear to many people, teaching them and opening their minds to the scriptures. He was preparing them for their next big step in becoming the church, the Body of Christ here on earth.

We are in that same forty-day time period today. This is still the Easter season, and we are still an Easter people. We are still being prepared for our mission as part of the Body of Christ, just like generations of Christians have been before us. Church tradition holds that Christ ascended into heaven on what is now known as Ascension Day, which falls on Thursday May 9th this year and is the fortieth day of Easter. This is one of the earliest Christian festivals dating back to around 68 CE. On the fiftieth day of Easter we will celebrate Pentecost, which falls on Sunday May 19th this year. Pentecost commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks. Everything really changed after that!

I think that powerful energy radiating all through St. Paul's is still the Holy Spirit, working through each of us to be the church. We are all being equipped for our mission to reach out to our community and beyond to spread God's love to all people. We are doing that in many wonderful, exciting, and fun ways.

- We do it through our Sunday school programs, confirmation classes, food pantry, food drives, and Vacation Bible School, and the One Rock One Community Gospel Concert.
- We do it when we support the Scouts, host civic organizations, and participate in our Association, Conference, and Council of Churches events.
- We do it when we build fellowship as a community of believers during the many small group fellowship programs and activities held all year long at St. Paul's.

This is a vibrant community of faith, full of the Holy Spirit, and poised to go out into the world to make disciples and share God's love. Embrace that energy, be a part of it, and invite your friends and neighbors to join us as we live out our faith as Easter people.




FRIENDSHIP WITH GOD!

Aflame With Faith

In the Old Testament, fire often symbolizes the presence of God's Spirit. For example, God called to Moses from a burning bush (Exodus 3:2-6) and defeated the prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel (1 Kings 18:30-39). In the New Testament, tongues of fire rested atop the believers gathered on Pentecost (Acts 2:3).

Some Christians have described a burning or currentlike sensation when they encounter God. Methodism founder John Wesley said his heart was "strangely warmed" during worship. After such an encounter, people often feel compelled to share the Good News of Jesus. The flame of faith inside one believer can spark a revival of faith in others. As Charles Spurgeon said, "A burning heart will soon find for itself a flaming tongue."

A House United

When President Lincoln declared in 1858, "A house divided against itself cannot stand," he was echoing Jesus. Scribes thought Jesus was casting out demons by Satan's power, so Jesus responded, "How can Satan cast out Satan? ... If a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand" (Mark 3:23-25, NIV). There are countless modern examples: Civil wars. Families torn apart. Business partners going separate ways. Even churches splitting. Jesus used the "house divided" image to point out the nonsense of the scribes' words. It takes someone other than the "strong man" (v. 27), or demon, occupying a space to cast that demon out. Evil can't drive out evil. Sin isn't stronger than sin. Hate doesn't solve hate. Violence doesn't end violence. Two wrongs don't make a right.

Jesus came to "bind" evil with goodness, conquer hate with love and teach us the same. Throughout the gospels, Jesus treats all people with love — even those who oppose him — so that, in the end, we all will be a house united by God's goodness.

A Prayer For Roots

O God, we thirst for you, as dry tree roots thirst for water in hot, dusty soil. Help us send spiritual roots down deep into the grace and knowledge of the One who is the same yesterday and today and forever, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who gives us stability when the earth shakes and the storms of life swirl about us.

Rooted and grounded in your love, and strengthened and comforted by your grace and your Spirit who gives us hope, may we be steadfast and immovable in the work Christ gives us to do, until he comes again. Amen.

Christian Symbol



GREEN — Green is the traditional liturgical color for the weeks after Pentecost (as well as the season of Epiphany). The Pentecost season largely overlaps with spring and summer, which is

fitting because green symbolizes growth: growth of plant life and crops, and growth of the church in discipleship and faith.
