Pastor's Page

Easter Greetings Summer Hill!

Is it just me, or have you also noticed the wave of revival flowing through St. Paul's Summer Hill? At first I wasn't exactly sure what it was, but I have been feeling some powerful energy radiating through our church community. I thought my optimism must just be from the beautiful spring days we have had, but then I still felt it even on those few pesky colder days last month. It started a while back, and kept getting stronger all through the Lenten season.

I think everyone must have really felt it during Holy Week, beginning on Palm Sunday and continuing to build during our Maundy Thursday Seder Meal service and Good Friday service. And if you did not feel it at one of our three wonderful Easter morning services, then perhaps you just haven't been to church lately. Because if you have been worshiping with us, I am sure you would agree that this power is the Holy Spirit at work in our lives.

I cannot help but think that this is the same feeling the disciples must have felt in the weeks after that very first Easter day, when the Risen Lord appeared to them with greetings of "Peace be with you." During the next forty days, Jesus continued to appear to many people, teaching them and opening their minds to the scriptures. He was preparing them for their next big step in becoming the church, the Body of Christ here on earth.

We are in that same type of forty-day period today. We are still being prepared for our mission as part of the Body of Christ, just like generations of Christians have been before us. Church tradition holds that Christ ascended into heaven on what is now known as Ascension Day, which falls on Thursday, May 29th this year and

is the fortieth day of Easter. This is one of the earliest Christian festivals dating back to around 68 CE.

On the fiftieth day of Easter we will celebrate Pentecost, which falls on Sunday, June 8th this year. Pentecost commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks. Everything really changed after that!

That powerful energy radiating all through St. Paul's is still the Holy Spirit, working through each of us to be the church. We are all being equipped for our mission to reach out to our community and beyond to spread God's love to all people. We are doing that in many wonderful, exciting, and fun ways.

- We do it through our Sunday school programs, confirmation classes, food pantry, food drives, and Vacation Bible School, and the One Rock One Community Gospel Concert.
- We do it when we support the Scouts, host civic organizations, and participate in our Association, Conference, and Council of Churches events.
- We do it when we build fellowship as a community of believers during the many small group fellowship programs and activities held all year long at St. Paul's.

This is a vibrant community of faith, full of the Holy Spirit, and poised to go out into the world to make disciples and share God's love. Embrace that energy, be a part of it, and invite your friends and neighbors to join us as we live out our faith as Easter people.

"He ascended into heaven..."



During his earthly ministry, Jesus could be physically present in only one place at any given time. "Only those could speak to him who came to where he was," explained Archbishop

William Temple. "If he was in Galilee, people could not find him in Jerusalem; if he was in Jerusalem, they could not find him in Galilee" (from *Readings in St. John's Gospel*).

Spiritually speaking, Christ's Ascension means he is with us wherever we find ourselves. Christ desires to be present with us everywhere we go. His presence is universal. He is here now. "Believed in throughout the world, taken up in glory" (1 Timothy 3:16, NRSV) — that is what the Ascension affirms.

You're Going Places!

Commencement marks the beginning of a new stage of life, with graduates heading off to discover opportunities and face challenges. *Oh, the Places You'll Go!* — a Dr. Seuss book that's now a popular graduation gift — whimsically explores life's ups and downs, twists and turns.

Young adults will face excitement and slumps, fun and loneliness. They'll feel a sense of purpose as well as confusion and even fear. "There are some [things], down the road between hither and yon, that can scare you so much you won't want to go on," writes Dr. Seuss.

In the storybook, the life-traveler's sheer determination propels him beyond difficulties. But God's children don't need to journey alone. Our heavenly Father walks beside us on every winding path and around every corner. Life cannot take us anywhere God hasn't been first. Graduates — and all Christians — can trust in the promise of Joshua 1:9 (NRSV): "Be strong and courageous ... for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."
