Pastor's Page

Greetings Summer Hill!

I am writing this letter on Ascension Day, ten days before Pentecost, which commemorates when Jesus ascended back to Heaven. This significant event profoundly impacted the lives of the disciples and the early Christian community. The followers of Jesus had undergone considerable experiences during the forty days since His resurrection. And now, just as they were becoming accustomed to the reality of Jesus being alive, He was preparing to depart from their visible presence. This change was very difficult for them to understand, especially when they were content with their current state.

Jesus emphasized that change is essential for experiencing new life. In the Gospel of John 12:24, Jesus stated, "Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." Although we recognize this truth, we often resist change by clinging to our old ways. Other times, change occurs so incrementally that we hardly notice until a new reality presents itself.

One remarkable transformation we witness is the development of our youth into young adults. This was evident during our Youth Sunday Service, where fourteen confirmands actively participated in the worship service. Each of these individuals has diligently worked through their faith journeys, emerging as strong and Spirit-filled members of our community. They are truly a gift to us all and the entire Body of Christ. I am confident that they will continue their paths and serve as effective Disciples of Christ throughout their lives, blessing us with their example.

On Pentecost Sunday, which marks the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples and the "birthday of the church," our second-year Confirmands will affirm the vows made on their behalf at baptism by proclaiming their belief in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, thereby entering full membership in the church. They are undergoing a visible and spiritual transformation, embarking on new life and faith journeys. This occasion represents a pinnacle experience for us all.

As I thank God for the blessings of new life, transformation, and spiritual growth, I remind myself that our journey resembles a marathon rather than a sprint. While mountaintop experiences provide temporary exhilaration, we must return to the realities of everyday life. These moments serve to reignite our ministries and guide us back to our paths, reminding us of the joy found within a faith community dedicated to teaching, sharing, and living God's love with neighbors near and far.

We can sustain the enthusiasm ignited by the Holy Spirit by recommitting to active participation in the Body of Christ through prayer, study, and good works. Like our Confirmands, we must embrace our vow "to participate in the life and mission of this family of God's people, sharing regularly in the worship of God and enlisting in the work of this local church as it serves this community and the world." Despite entering the summer months, numerous opportunities exist for involvement in church activities. Upcoming events include baptisms, new member receptions, outdoor worship services, Vacation Bible School, home visitations, mission trips, church camp, community service programs, Scouts. fundraising activities, fellowship opportunities, and initiatives to assist neighbors in need.

If you have ideas or inspiration for how Summer Hill can effectively demonstrate our love, please share them with me or any member of our Consistory. Get involved and help bring these ideas to fruition. Invite friends and neighbors to join our ministry and discover why we are all part of the one family of Christ. We are only beginning, so do not miss out on these transformative experiences.

Celebrating the Church's Birthday

On Pentecost, we remember when the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus' disciples. As they gathered in Jerusalem 10 days after Jesus' ascension, they saw tongues of fire, heard rushing wind and began speaking in many languages. Because the disciples could then share the good news with all the pilgrims assembled for the Pentecost festival, the occasion marks the birthday of the Christian church. That day alone, about 3,000 people devoted their lives to Christ.

Like the Holy Spirit, Pentecost is important and relevant today. As theologian Henri Nouwen writes, "Without Pentecost the Christ-event — the life, death and resurrection of Jesus — remains imprisoned in history as something to remember, think about and reflect on. The Spirit of Jesus comes to dwell within us, so that we can become living Christs here and now."

STEWARDSHIP

St. Paul's Summer Hill offers more than Sunday services. We teach Sunday School, Confirmation, and Bible Study classes. Our mission projects include the Schuylkill Haven Food Bank, Servants to All, and the Council of Churches. The church hosts meetings for the Boy Scouts and various committees. We organize fellowship events, visit hospitals and nursing homes, comfort those in loss, and provide spiritual care. We plan weddings, banquets, and ecumenical events with other area churches. We also maintain the church building and property.

Our leadership and staff are dedicated to helping us become who God wants us to be. The church's ministry and mission rely on the spiritual and financial contributions from our members and friends. These resources support our mission and require real money to provide spiritual services.
